RUBIACEAE

The Coffee Family

In the tropics this family comprises mainly trees and shrubs all of which have simple, entire, opposite leaves. The stipules sheath the stem and may be divided into segments. Whatever their form, they occur between each pair of petioles (interpetiolar). Flowers are regular and bisexual with 4 or 5 free sepals, 4 or 5 fused petals, 4 or 5 stamens (inserted on the corolla tube) and a single inferior ovary. Coffee is the main crop plant in this group while other members are cultivated as flowering shrubs (e.g *lxora*).
